# 2018 Summer Session Descriptions

Grade levels are for incoming students as of 9/1/2018

**\*Anatomy and Physiology I:** In this course students will examine the structure and functions of the body and the mechanisms for maintaining homeostasis. Areas of study include: skeletal, muscular and nervous systems; endocrine, cardiovascular, respiratory, digestive and reproductive systems. Concepts to be covered include: development, metabolism, and balance. \*NOTE: Students earn 2.5 HS credits upon successful completion of this course. Students will be required to complete work outside of class time. (Grades 11 to 12) **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**Art Studio:** In this session students work with a variety of media and subject matter. Topics may include: drawing, painting, airbrushing and sculpture. Demonstrations and suggestions for projects will be provided, or students may choose to pursue their own interests, with individualized teacher support. Advanced students may wish to develop their portfolio, while other students may spend time expanding their skills and experience. (Grades 9 to 12) **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**ASVAB Prep- ELA:** This course is designed for incoming seniors who do not yet have a test of record to graduate. Students who take this summer course will take practice ASVAB tests and receive test taking strategies to prepare them for success on the ELA portions of the ASVAB which they will take in early fall. Note: Students are highly encouraged to take both the ELA and math ASVAB prep courses to best prepare for success of the test. **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**ASVAB Prep- Math:** This course is designed for incoming seniors who do not yet have a test of record to graduate. Students who take this summer course will take practice ASVAB tests and receive test taking strategies to prepare them for success on the math portions of the ASVAB which they will take in early fall. Note: Students are highly encouraged to take both the ELA and math ASVAB prep courses to best prepare for success of the test. **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**Instrumental Band:** This program is designed to provide students, grades 5-8, with high quality and personalized instruction on their instruments. Students enrolled have the opportunity to participate in both large ensemble performances and in small ensemble and/or personalized lessons otherwise reserved for students enrolled in private study. It is our hope that with these opportunities, students enrolled will have additional opportunities to engage with playing in a band, and as such develop a love for music making in the band genre. **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**Media I:** This course will provide students with basic understanding of the wide variety of careers in the mass media field, technology used to create media elements, and some ways video is used to affect an audience. Upon completion of Media I, students should be able to demonstrate production skills and techniques to produce a variety of video projects. Some projects include school news programs, scenes for a short film, commercials, and public service announcements. This intensive three-week course will count as school credit to fulfil the practical arts requirement. **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**Movie Workshop:** In this session students will work together to write, shoot, and edit their own short movies and create a DVD of their work to show off at home. The Summer Movie Workshop is a 4-week enrichment program open to all Clearview students, including this year's graduates. It is a great opportunity for students to spend their summer in a fun, creative, and rewarding environment.

(Grades 9 to 12) **\*CHS students only\***

**SAT Prep- English & Math:** In this session students will be prepared for the English and Math portions of the S.A.T. including the most recent updates to the test. (Grades 9-12) **\*Out of district students welcomed\***

**Writing the College Essay:** In this one-day session students will have the opportunity to learn how to compose a strong college entrance essay under the guidance of an experienced high school English teacher. Students will examine essay models and have an opportunity to write their own college essay with teacher guidance. **\*Out of district students welcomed\***
